



1.3. Executive Summary

Quality of Education becomes the global agenda as per sustainable development goal number 4. Nations are striving to improve and ensure quality of education. Ensuring quality of higher education in Pakistan is the responsibility of Higher Education Commission of Pakistan. HEC has taken different initiatives for quality assurance in higher education, one of these initiatives is the establishment of accreditation councils.

The National Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (NACTE) is authorized to assess and evaluate the quality of teacher education programs conducted by public and private sector colleges and universities. The Council mission is to ensure the conduct of high-quality teacher education programmes as an integral part of higher education through a sustained professional internal and external academic evaluation. Its mandate includes all teacher education programmes offered by the institutions of higher learning.

The annual report for the financial year 2021-2022 presents an account of the Council activities, successes and challenges and future plan.


During the reporting year (2021-2022) NACTE had carried out accreditation visits of 74 teacher education programmes in the different regions of country and accredited different teacher education programmes including MA, BS, B.Ed., MS. The council also held its 16th and 17th accreditation committee meetings during reporting year and awarded the levels of accreditation to visited teacher education programmes. The council also held the 18th and 19th council meetings during the reporting year where deliberations and decisions were made for presented agenda items. Over the past year NACTE wrote letters to public and private universities' registrars seeking information about teacher education programmes and enrollment. In the light of members' feedback, the council has updated the strategic plan 2030 and planned activities and timeline to achieve the objectives and goals of strategic plan.



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


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3.1. 16th National Accreditation Committee Meeting

The Council held its 16th Accreditation Committee meeting on September 07, 2021, in which the proposal for various awards of accreditation was presented. The Committee endorsed the proposal for the award of Zero accreditation and Formal accreditation of teacher education programmes offered by the institutions. The details of the award are as follows:

- Zero accreditation to Nine (09) teacher education programmes
- Z level accreditation to 03 teacher education programmes
- Y level accreditation to 07 teacher education programmes
- X level accreditation to 05 teacher education programmes



3.2. 17th National Accreditation Committee Meeting

The Council held its 17th Accreditation Committee meeting on June 23, 2022, in which the proposal for various awards of accreditation was presented. The Committee endorsed the proposal for the award of Zero accreditation and Formal accreditation of teacher education programmes offered by the institutions. The details of the award are as follows:

- Zero accreditation to 32 teacher education programmes
- Z level accreditation to 05 teacher education programmes
- Y level accreditation to 18 teacher education programmes

3.3. 18th Council Meeting

The Council held its 18th meeting of the National Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (NACTE) on September 09, 2021, at 11:00am at Lecture Hall, HEC H-9 Islamabad. The meeting was attended by Eighteen (18) members and Two (02) members regretted to attend the meeting due to their commitments or engagements. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Memon, Chairperson, National Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (NACTE) chaired the meeting through a video link. The Chairperson welcomed all the members, especially the new members and the new Council Secretary to join the Council. He thanked the outgoing members and appreciated their effective contribution for enhancing performance of the Council. After introduction of the members, formal proceedings of the meeting

started. The Council Secretary presented twenty-four (24) agenda items one by one for deliberations and decisions. The major decisions made during 18th council meeting were as;

- 1. Approval of tenure of the Councils' Secretary
- 2. Approval of extension in contract periods of the council secretariate staff
- 3. Approval of formal accreditation levels to twenty-five (25) teacher education programmes
- 4. Approval of award of zero accreditation to twenty-five (25) teacher education programmes
- 5. Approval of Council budgets, audit reports and annual action plans
- 6. Approval of waiver of late fee at the rate of Rs. 10,000/ month
- 7. Approval of recruitment procedure to fill the vacant positions in the council.
- 8. Approval of the engagement of internees
- 9. Approval of NACTE Action Plan for the year 2020-2021.





3.4. 19th Council Meeting

The 19th meeting of the National Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (NACTE) was held on June 23, 2022, at 11:30am at Lecture Hall, HEC H-9 Islamabad. It was attended by Fourteen (14) members and Six (06) members regretted to attend the meeting due to their commitments or engagements. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Memon, Chairperson, National Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (NACTE) chaired the meeting. The Council Secretary presented twelve (12) agenda items for deliberations and decisions -making. Major decisions were;

- 1. Approval of formal accreditation levels to Thirty-one (31) teacher education programmes
- 2. Approval of award of zero accreditation to Thirty-Two (32) teacher education programmes
- 3. Approval of rectified award of accreditation levels to six (06) teacher education programmes
- 4. Approval of extension in contract periods of the council secretariate staff
- 5. Approval of council's audit report of FY 2019-2020
- 6. Approval of recruitment procedure to fill the vacant positions of Data Entry Operator in the council.





3.5. Staff Meetings

- The 6th (online) meeting of Secretariate Staff was held on Friday, July 16, 2021. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Memon, Chairperson NACTE welcomed the internees and wished them their work experience rewarding. The Council Secretary gave an update on the ongoing accreditation visits and the process of accreditation data analysis, data verification and report writing. It was decided in the meeting that the Secretary NACTE will share with the Chairperson the draft agenda and working paper of upcoming council meeting for review.
- 2. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Memon, Chairperson NACTE chaired 7th staff meeting on November 12, 2021. The Secretary of the Council shared a report on the follow-up of the last meeting decisions. He also presented a progress on the accreditation visits. The revision of teacher education programmes was also discussed. It was also proposed to hold a meeting of the Deans, Faculty of Education from the selected universities in collaboration with Prof. Dr. Nasir Mahmood, Dean, Faculty of Education, Allama Iqbal Open University, Islamabad to review the existing teacher education roadmap and curriculum. The meeting will take place soon.
- 3. The Chairperson, NACTE chaired 8th (online) staff meeting held on March 3, 2022. The Chairperson was informed about the tasks accomplished, ongoing activities especially accreditation visits completed and planned for the next month. The forthcoming events and activities were also discussed.



3.6. National Curriculum Review Committee (NCRC) Meetings

Prof. Dr. Muhammad Memon, Chairperson of the Council and Dr. Muhammad Khalid Mahmood, Secretary of the Council participated in the series of NCRC meetings held on July 1-2, 2021, in Peshawar, on March 7-8, 2022, at HEC, Regional Centre, Lahore and on April 1,2022, where they shared their perspective on the development of teacher education roadmap and curriculum.

3.7. Executive. Director Hec Meeting with Chairperson of Councils

The Executive Director, HEC convened a meeting of all Council Chairpersons on December 15, 2021, to review the councils' activities and their future plans to make the council independent and financially sustainable. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Memon, Chairperson of the Council participated in the meeting. All Council Chairpersons deliberated on the process required to make the Councils independent and financially sustainable through an Act of Parliament.

3.8. Meeting With HEC Advisor Academics, Director QAA and Dean Faculty of Education, AIOU

The Chairperson of Council had a meeting with Mr. Raza Chohan, Advisor Academics Division, HEC on December 15, 2021, to discuss teacher education roadmap which is a matter of an urgency. The Advisor Academics informed that NCRC meeting will be convened soon, and the Council Chairperson and Secretary will be invited to give their input in the NCRC meeting. The Chairperson had a meeting with Syed Nasir Shah, Director / In-charge QAA, to discuss the Council related matters and requested funding for training of NACTE external evaluators, national conference and revision of accreditation standards, tools and procedures. The In-charge QAA assured every possible support from QAA for the proposed activities of the Council. The Chairperson, NACTE met Prof. Dr. Nasir Mahmood, Dean, Faculty of Education, Allama Iqbal Open University, Islamabad (also a member of the Council) to discuss teacher education roadmap and a possible research study on the quality of teachers in the country. Dr. Nasir Mahmood appreciated the idea of research study on teacher quality and assured his full support to conduct the study and hold a consultation meeting with the Deans and Directors of the selected universities to discuss teacher education roadmap.

3.9. Orientation Meetings

3.11. Data Collection on Teacher Education Programmes

The council secretariate had a target of knowing the total number of teacher education programmes being offered in public and private sector universities and affiliated colleges. Council secretariate try to accomplish the task through web search and by writing letters to the registrars of the universities.

- It was found from the websites of the universities that 74 out of 147 public sector universities are offering 378 teacher education programmes and 40 out of 100 private sector universities were offering 126 teacher education programmes i.e., 114 universities are offering 504 teacher education programmes.
- In response to letters to the registrar, the secretariate could receive response from fifty-three (53) universities. Response from sixty-one (61) universities not received even after five (5) reminder letters.
- Fifty-three (53) universities have 241 affiliated colleges/institutions offering 673 teacher education programmes.

3.12. Revision of NACTE Standards, Tools and Procedures


Consequent upon the approval of the Council in its 18th meeting held on September 9, 2021, the Chairperson, NACTE constituted an Expert Committee (EC) for the revision of Teacher Education Accreditation Framework including Standards, Tools and Procedures. The Expert Committee (EC) aimed to review the teacher education accreditation framework, standards, tools and procedures and make recommendations to the Council for approval.

A series of online and face-to-face meetings of the expert committee have been organized by the Secretariat. The experts have reviewed the accreditation standards, tools and procedures thoroughly and suggested needful changes in standards, tools and procedures. The work is in progress.

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3.13. Newsletter

The council has published 3 newsletters for year 2021-2022. The first newsletter was published for July-September 2021, 2nd for Oct-March 2022 and 3rd for April-June 2022. For three of the newsletters, council has highlighted main events of time duration and future activities.
